With 10,000 people a day turning 65 for the next 15 years we all, workers and volunteers alike, have our work cut out for us. As the need to care for this population increases, the demand for volunteer services will be challenging, not only in recruiting enough qualified, dedicated volunteers to meet the needs but to also find that extra incentive or enticement that will appeal to prospective volunteers and draw them in to choose Hospice Visions, Inc. above all the other organizations.

Sadly, a few of our seasoned volunteers have either moved out of the area or have developed health issues that now prevent them from volunteering, they will be sorely missed! Happily we have recruited 13 new volunteers since July of 2014 including "Asa". Asa, a Golden-Doodle is our new licensed, certified quadruped volunteer. Among our new recruits is a married couple, Matt and Carol Tombre, who have signed on to be Veteran-to-Veteran Volunteers and have been seeing two Veterans receiving our services. In addition to our standard recruitment tactics we are recruiting volunteers 24 hours a day over the world-wide-web on two different volunteer sites, volunteermatch.org and pointsoflight.org. Many have inquired and a few have joined our team.

To our good fortune 13 area high school students have come and gone through our Teen Volunteer Program in the past twelve months. Some completed required hours for their CNA class and others completing their Senior Projects. One of our Canyon Ridge Teen Volunteers will be starting employment with us as a CNA...and one of our new Teen Volunteers is going to earn the Congressional Award for Volunteer Service that will award her scholarships and will give her resume a little extra clout. In addition to our Teen Volunteer Program we now have two elementary school Jr. Volunteers. They volunteer with their Grandma who has been volunteering with us for about a year.



WE HONOR VETERANS

Meeting The Needs of Our Veterans

2015 has been an exciting year for Hospice Visions, Inc. We reached the highest level in the “WE HONOR VETERANS” program. We are now part of an elite group of four star veteran support organizations. This enables the VA staff and Veterans to easily identify hospices that have made a commitment to offer Veteran-specific care and services provided by a competent and highly skilled workforce. As a Partner, Hospice Visions, Inc. can promote their level of commitment to Veterans by displaying the “We Honor Veterans” partner logo on their websites, as well as community outreach and educational materials.

In June of 2015 Hospice Visions, Inc. sponsored the first, of many more Welcome Home Vietnam Veteran Celebrations in the Magic Valley. Aligning with The United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration Association and working with local Veterans Groups and Vietnam Veterans our inaugural event had more than seventy-five motorcycles in the park after a procession through town honoring our Vietnam Veterans. We served over three-hundred participants’ free hotdogs, hamburgers and soft drinks donated by the community.

The social work team at Hospice Visions, Inc. is strongly motivated to help patients and families identify and clarify opportunities for growth, even at the end of life. Often, growth is made evident through the disclosure of unfulfilled wishes, or dreams.

Hospice Visions, Inc. works in partnership with the dream foundation® to assist hospice patients and their family members in potential access to unfulfilled dreams.

This year, the social work team helped a patient and her spouse to locate a long-lost son. After the arduous undertaking and successful location the young man, contact was initiated. The team worked together with the dream foundation® in order for travel and lodging to be granted while reconnecting with his mother and father.

In another instance, and through the generosity of the dream foundation® a woman was granted a last hurrah with an old friend, in which a spa-day, meals and an overnight stay at a winery was coordinated.



Hospice Visions, Inc. is highly motivated to contribute to the well-being of the residents of the Magic Valley. To this end, the Home Safe Home program was created. Its intent is to assist our neighbors in access to community resources, short to long-term planning and information/advocacy. Home Safe Home is a patient-driven program; qualified staff are available to assist.

The social work team worked to support a woman who had developed significant issues with her living situation. She had been living in a rather cluttered environment, and had also been struggling with an insect infestation. Via Home Safe Home, the team contributed to her connection to community resources and helped her to identify a support network in order to address the situation successfully.

The team also worked to help a family in attending to their safety and to the placement of a loved one who was at risk to being a danger to himself and/or his loved ones. The Home Safe Home team worked tirelessly to help the family access benefits and provided expert assistance to the family in order to locate a facility providing specialized care to offer shelter and safety to their loved one in need.






Hospice Visions, Inc. Revenue




Patients by Diagnoses




Hospice Visions, Inc. Expenses




Patients by Age
